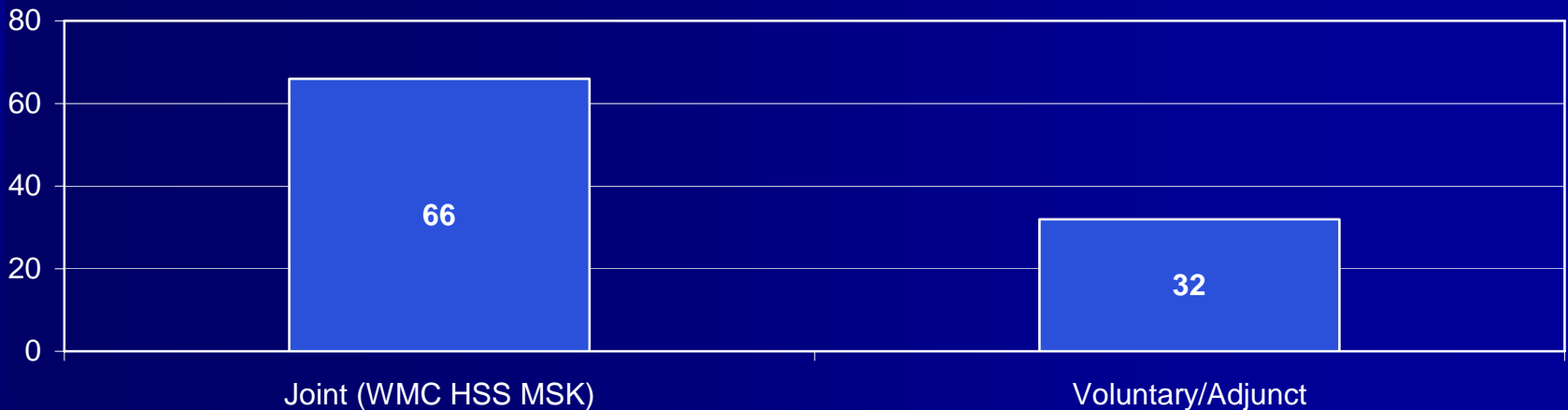
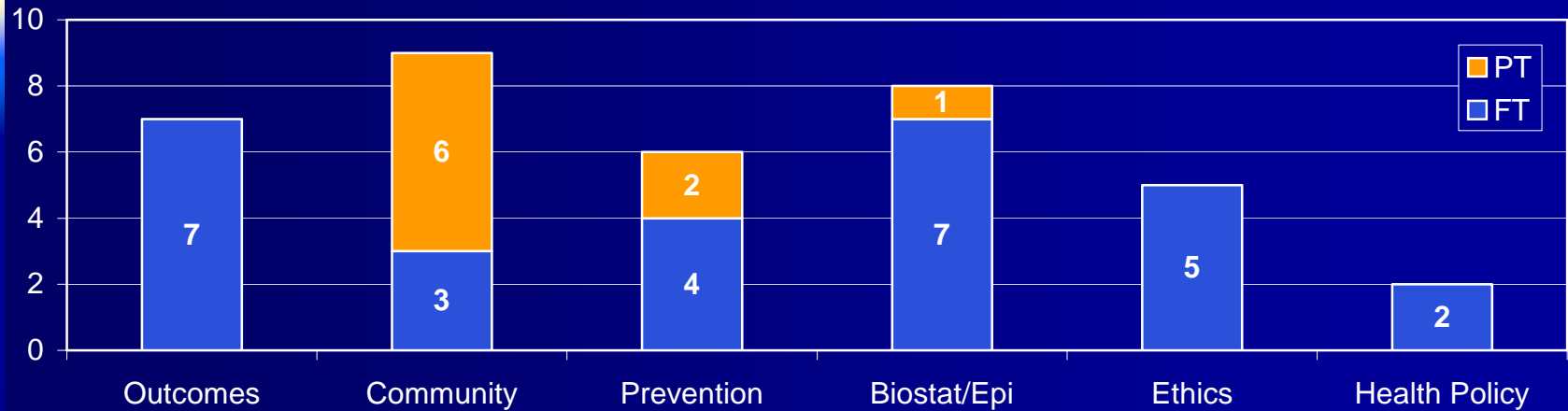

as of June 30, 2006



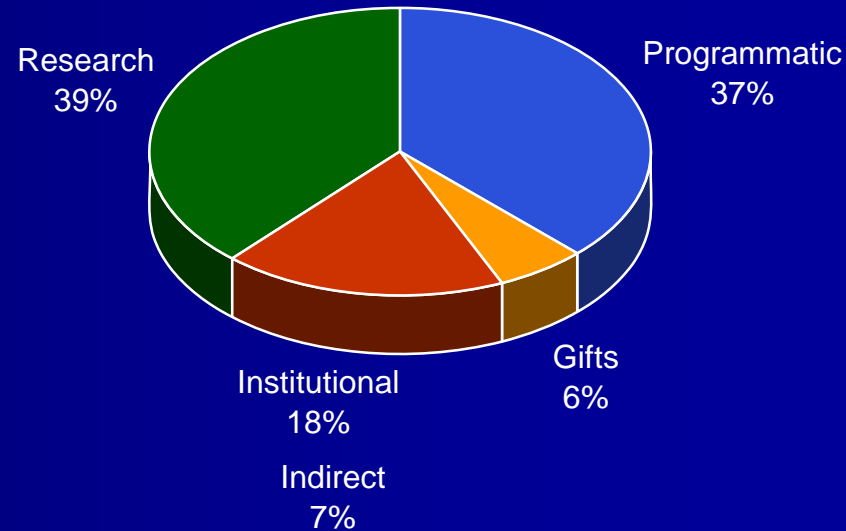

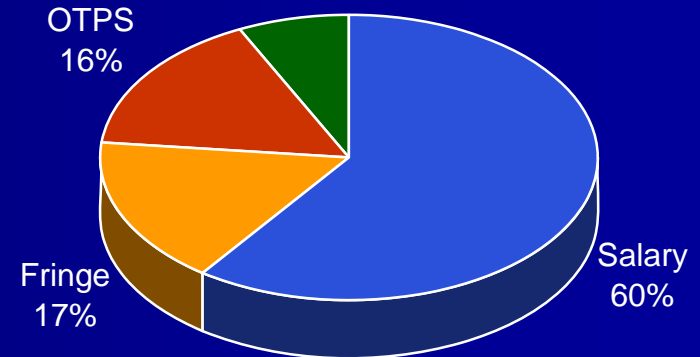
Our “financial” profile

- Where we get our funds...

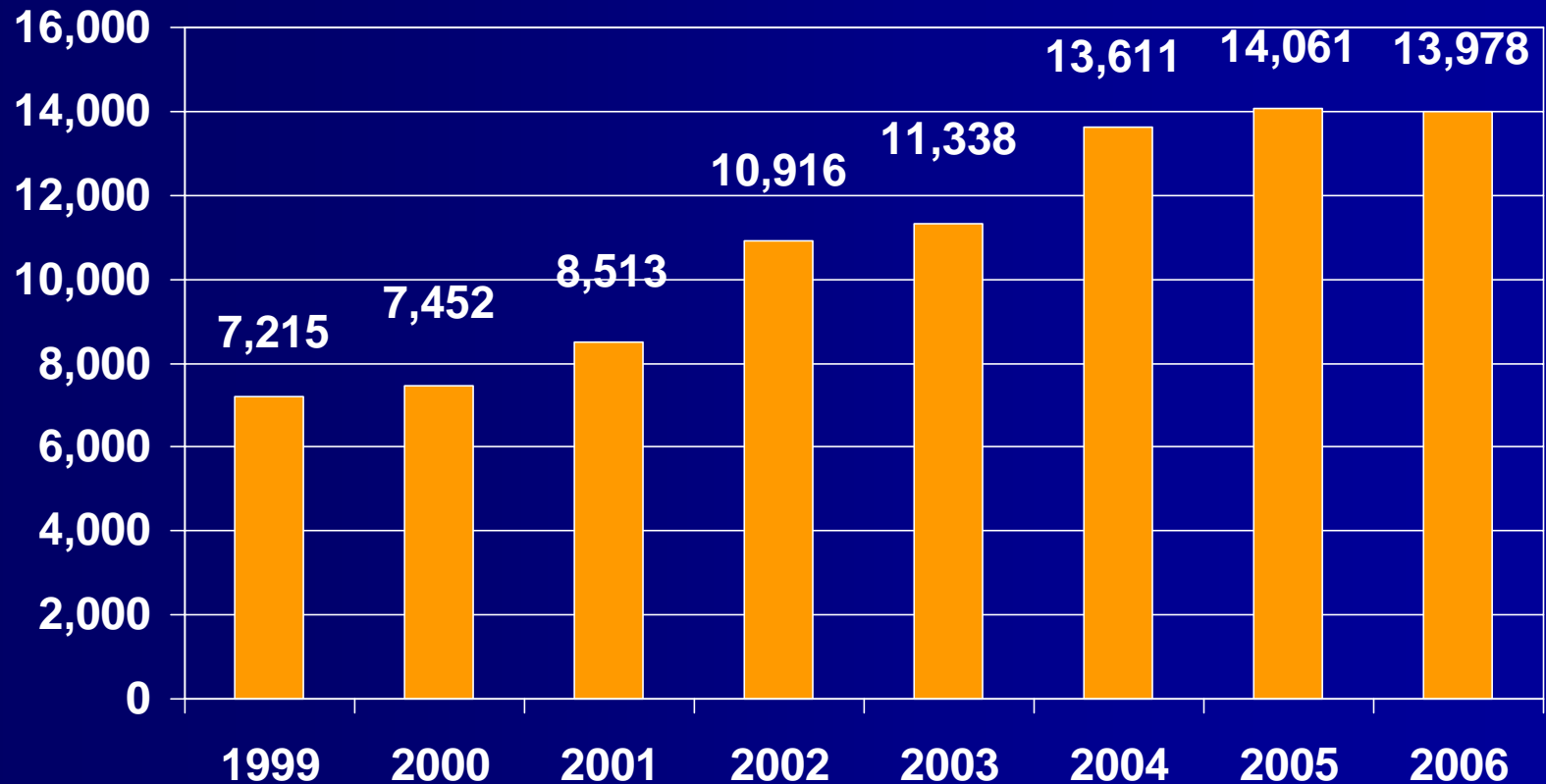


- How we spend our funds...

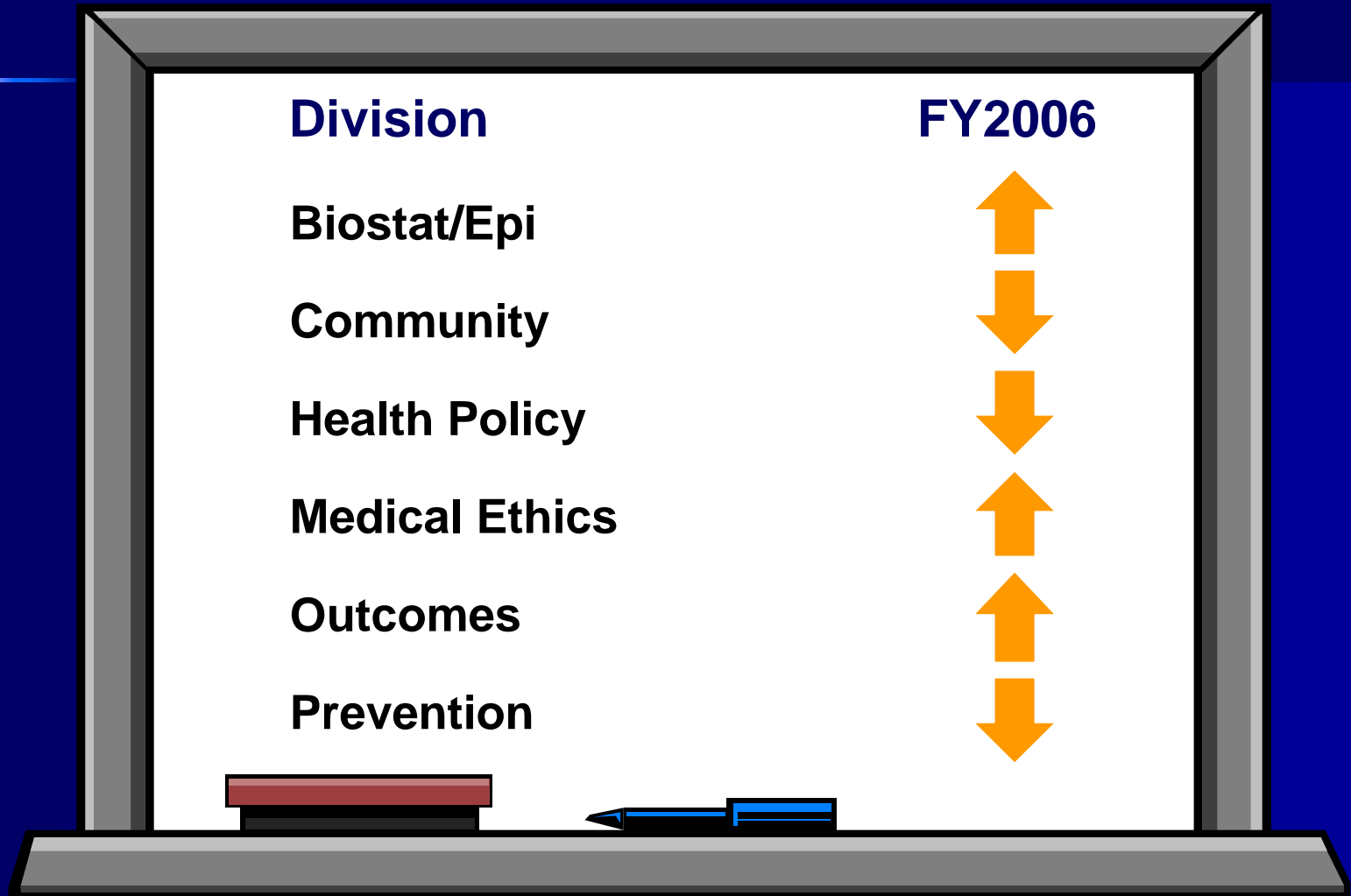


Operation – leveling off

(annual operation – expense side)

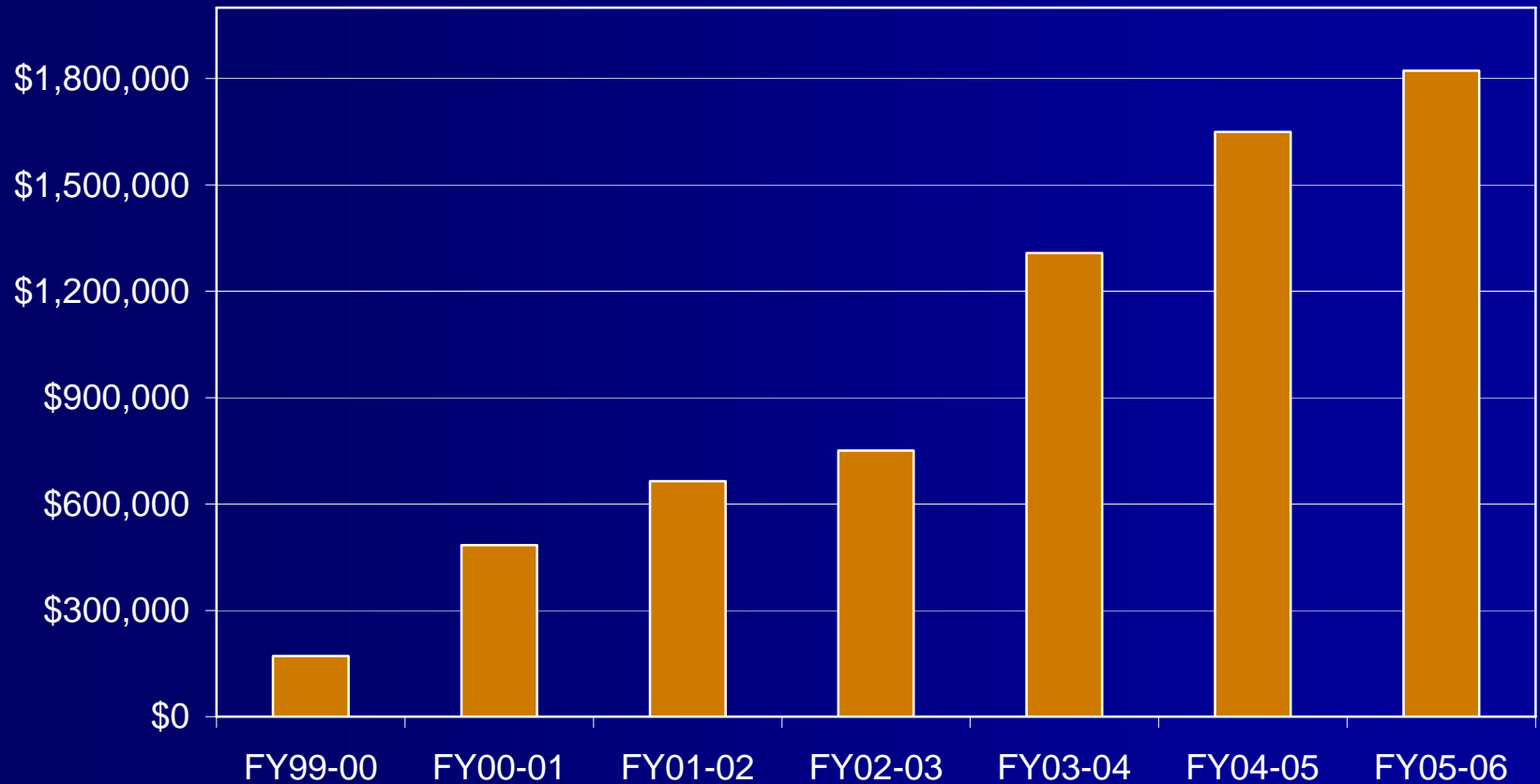


Behind the numbers



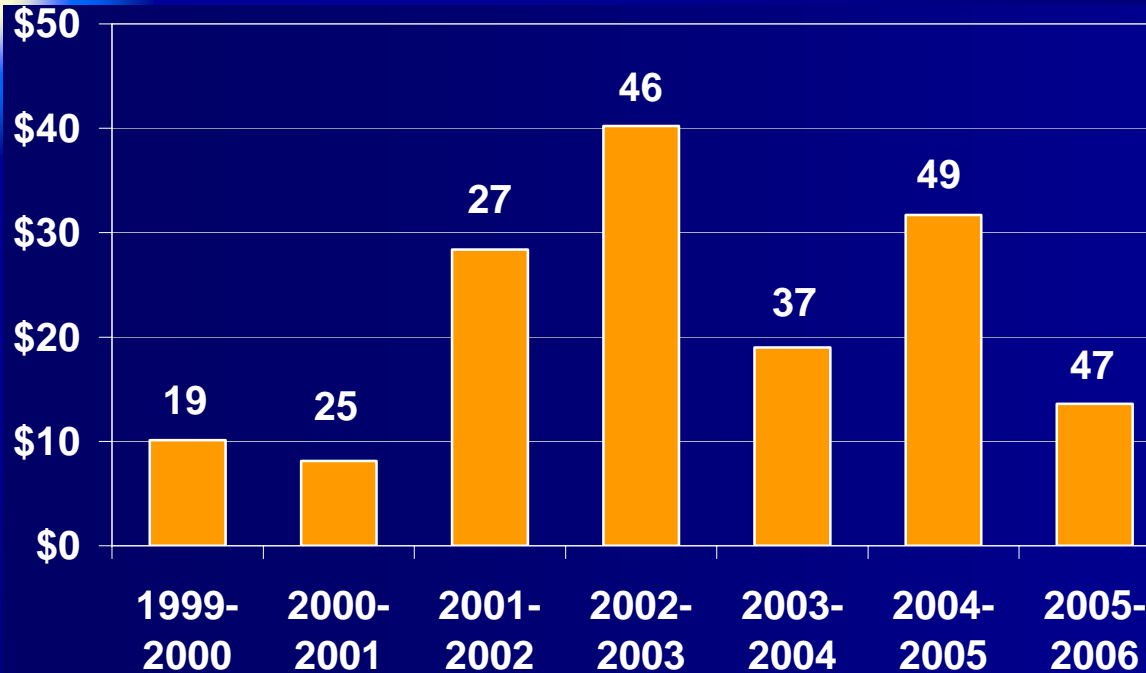
Financial health – growth of departmental reserves

(discretionary funds available as of June 30th)



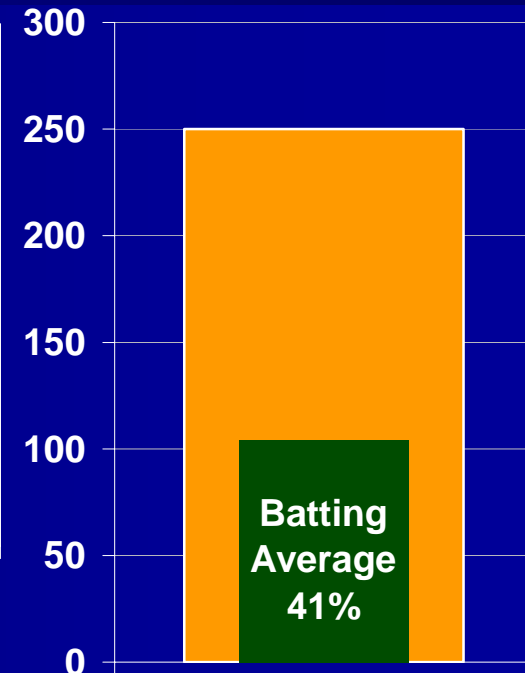
Research batting average...
